REPORTING TO PARENTS

INFLUENZA A 'SWINE FLU' INFORMATION

Ministry of Education guidance as noted on the Ministry of Health website information to supply to parents:

- 1. If your child is sick with flu symptoms keep them at home and contact their local doctor or health centre or call Healthline on 0800 611 116.
- 2. If your child is being kept home, for whatever reason, you must inform the school immediately.
- 3. The Ministry of Education has supplied all schools with information produced by the Auckland Regional Public Health Service to ensure schools are well prepared if an outbreak occurs. Further updates will be taking place as information comes to hand.
- 4. The Ministry of Education website also has information available for you to view if you wish Pandemic Planning (www.mindedu.govt.nz).
- 5. Hygiene is the most important step in preventing the spread of influenza. Washing hands thoroughly, for at least 20 seconds with soap and drying hands well, or using an alcohol-based rub, are the best ways to protect yourself from the spread of germs. Keep coughs and sneezes covered, and dispose of tissues in a covered, lined rubbish bin. Try to stay a metre away from sick people.

HEADLICE

The school is experiencing an outbreak of headlice. Please check your child's hair carefully and treat the condition if nits or headlice are found. Chemists or our school's public health nurse can give advice if you are unsure what to do.

ROAD PATROL

The Road Patrol rosters are being prepared for Term 3. We have a few spaces where we require helpers to supervise the children. These are:

- Gloucester Street—Wednesday afternoon and Thursday afternoon
- Osier Road—Tuesday morning and Thursday morning.
