STUDENT-LED CONFERENCES

 you can not organize child care, please let the
 school office know.

MID-YEAR REPORTS

We will publish the National Standards indicators on a separate sheet. They will be given out at the SLCs. These are 'guides' of how your child is going — the 'end of year' assessments we send away to the Ministry of Education.

I have read all the reports and I want to say how great it is to read about the learning and growth the children of GMS have shown this year. Keep up the fantastic effort and aim for 'excellence'!
