The final last few weeks of our very busy term are upon us ... and just as expected, things don't really slow at all. Outlined below are just some of the events scheduled between now and Friday 15 April.

WELCOME TO GREENMEADOWS SCHOOL

We welcome two new students to our school who have enrolled over the past two weeks: Kylah Hansen and Maisie Delamere. It is fantastic to have you both at our school. These new students take our current roll to 432 students.

MILK AND WATER AT SCHOOL

Last year our Board of Trustees were contacted by the local DHB to consider limiting the presence of sugared drinks in our school. A lot of deliberation has gone on since this time towards this request. The results from our community survey last year contributed to this thinking. The question asked in the survey on this topic was:

Do you support the school putting in place a policy that only allows plain milk or water to be available at school at all times?

The responses were:

Strongly Agree — 36% Agree—23% Sometimes Agree—19%

Disagree—16% Strongly Disagree—6%

With this in mind the Board have implemented a policy linked to this. From the beginning of Term 2 the school canteen will no longer be selling any sugary drinks. Water will be the only drink available to purchase from the canteen.

Note that this will not be a blanket ban and there will be some special occasions (e.g. fundraisers, Discos) that the policy will allow a change. The purpose is to promote water as a main form of hydration for students, as well as awareness of the potential impact of overconsumption of drinks that are high in sugar. Coincidentally less than a week after we made our decision, the Ministry of Education asked all New Zealand schools to consider doing exactly what GMS has done.

Please continue to support our canteen. A new menu will be sent out start of Term 2 with a few new additions — so keep an eye out for that.

ANZAC DAY COMMEMORATION

The Taradale RSA have created a special youth ANZAC service for local schools which they hope will become an annual event. On Friday 15 April (the last day of Term 1) all Year 6 children have been invited to attend the service at the Taradale clock. This will run from 11.00am and take approximately an hour. Year 6 children will receive a notice with more information about this next week.

On Friday 4th March, the Taradale RSA hosted the 'Spirit of ANZAC' speech competition. Year 6 students Georgia Brown and Maia Driver confidently and ably represented Greenmeadows School. Georgia spoke about visiting the amazing exhibits at Te Papa and the National War Memorial Museum in Wellington and the profound impact they had on her. Maia spoke about a true New Zealand hero - Caesar the Red Cross bulldog.

They both received a copy of the book 'Le Quesnoy - The story of the town New Zealand saved'. They will also share their speeches with the Totara team next Monday at syndicate assembly.
