# PROPOSED WHANAU CLASS FOR 2017

Earlier this term we asked families of students who would be in the Totara syndicate next year if they would consider their children being part of a possible 'whanau class' for 2017. Mrs Pixie Bryan was an ideal person to take this class.

We received almost twenty positive messages of support for this idea. However with the pressure on our roll next year, we needed a class size of around 27 students (in the Totara syndicate) to go ahead with this. As a result it has been decided that Mrs Bryan will now take a Year 5 class next year which will be a 'mainstream' class, rather than a whanau class focussing on Maori culture, language and identity.

The prospect of whanau class for 2018 will be explored and investigated during the course of next year.
