# Greenmeadows School App

With a busy school like ours, there are so many different things happening at any one time. Getting information out to all our whanau is a challenge - that is a key reason for our school developing our own 'app' during 2016. We currently have about 450 subscribers to the app which is great, although it means that currently not every family has access to it.

Things you find on the GMS app include:

One of the most useful features of the app is the ability to send out 'alerts' which are basically text messages. The app allows users to select the apps they want to receive. This includes specific class messages, individual sports, syndicate messages and PTA notifications. # Traffic Safety Around GMS

With the increasing numbers of students at school, this means that there are more vehicles around transporting children to and from school. As with so many other schools traffic congestion is becoming a real problem, and this then brings dangers.

One aspect that is causing concern is the number of children not using our road crossing on Osier Road. Last week a very near miss occurred when one of the younger children at school suddenly walked out onto the road from between parked cars. Obviously the child was totally unexpected by the vehicle driving towards them.

Parents, please help and model safe crossing by using the correct place using the Kiwi Crossing by the main school gate. Children will imitate behaviour they see from others, so we all have a role to play in developing these safe habits. It would be an absolute tragedy if a child was hurt moving into traffic in a place away from the controlled Kiwi crossing. Could parents also be patient when collecting children at the end of the school day. A couple of local businesses have contacted us with concerns about GMS parent vehicles parking in their car parks, denying their own customers the access they need. Please consider these businesses who do a lot for our school and community.
