Each of the runners who finished in the top 30 of the races on Tuesday are able to enter into the Hawkes Bay Cross-country champs




Pictured: The entire team of runners - all 48 who represented Greenmeadows School and took out the Napier champs!

#### **BUILDING UPDATE**

The wheels are not moving as quickly in the classroom development as we would like ... but unfortunately it is out of the influence of GMS. It now appears that renovations on the three prefab buildings outside Teams 1 and 2 (the old Rooms 1 to 4) will start in the holiday break. The three classrooms will be raised up and a deck be constructed. Temporary steps have been constructed to the deck at the end of the old Room 4 so there will be access to the deck while the construction is taking place.

The work on the prefabs will take about six weeks. Rather than fill Team 1 (the room with Mrs McKay and Miss Millner) with too many children - we only have one space left in the school for the latest new entrants - our staffroom. Mrs de Lange will set up a temporary classroom in the staffroom for the first few weeks of next term. Once the prefabs have been smartened up and looking brilliant, then the New Entrant students will move with Mrs de Lange into the classroom closest to the dental clinic.

Some work will also start on the block with Rooms 8 to 11 in it. This Block will be reroofed and repaired during the holiday break.

#### PARENT SESSION - MARK OSBORNE

The parent meeting held on Wednesday night was a very interesting one. Mark talked about the trends in jobs for the future and the impact technology is going to have on the types of work that will disappear by the time children starting as five year olds now will encounter when they graduate from school in about thirteen years time.
