SCHOOL FEES AND PAYMENTS

It is fantastic to see so many of our school students involved with sports this term. Many in our community may not realise this ... but our school subsidizes much of the true cost of sports subscriptions that children are involved in throughout the year. Greenmeadows School chooses to do this to make it as easy as possible to have as many children involved in sport. We also do everything we can to keep subscriptions below a capped amount. The school pays the subscription amounts up front and often before the season or term has started. We then carry this cost until families pay the fees for their children through the invoices we send out.

To make it easier during the year families are able to set up automatic payments to your child's account.

These payments will be allocated to outstanding sports & activity fees throughout the year.
