Dolphin Academy are the new operators going into the Green Family Taradale Pool, which is located on the grounds of Taradale Primary School. They open their doors in February 2021 and will offer Learn to Swim classes operating up to 6 days a week including Saturday. There may also be availability for one on one classes and outside of these times depending on lane availability.
