

PMP PROGRAMME-TERMS 2 AND 3

'PMP' stands for 'Perceptual Motor Programme'. This programme is being incorporated into the school on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays during Terms 2 and 3. Kowhai team students will experience sequenced activities that include crawling, jumping and catching. The activities include perceptions of space and rhythm, memory and hand/eye coordination. All these activities will help the children develop reading, writing, mathematics and language skills.
