BUDGET DECISIONS IMPACT ON GMS

Many of you will be aware that the Government's intentions to change school staffing ratios from the start of 2013 were confirmed last week in the Budget. This change will have a definite impact on our school and the size of classes particularly for children who are aged 6, 7 and 8 years of age. At Greenmeadows School we aim to keep the class sizes in the earlier years of schooling as low as possible, despite having had the pressures of a growing roll over the past few years. From 2013 every child in a Year 2 and/or 3 class could potentially have to up to four or five additional children in each room to counter the adjusted staff ratios. We may be forced to do this as we will be aiming to offer the same support programmes we currently provide across the school. An increase in numbers of learners add a whole new dynamic to any classroom. Extra students mean the teachers have even less time to spend with individual children helping them make the progress we all desire. As an advocate for your children I do not think this is desirable or fair.

At Greenmeadows School we are all very concerned about the impact this change will have. New Zealand already has class sizes higher than the average of the OECD countries that we consistently compare with favourably in terms of results. In 2013 these average class sizes are going to be even higher. Some find it easy to think back to 'the old days' when classes had more than 40 students - but in reality school environments and programmes of learning are completely different and more challenging in 2012.

At Greenmeadows School we want to help all our learners meet current expectations based on our modern curriculum. That task will be even harder from 2013 if this change in staffing goes through.

The second term is marching on and the BOT are busy working to ensure the governance and direction of Greenmeadows School is in harmony with the MOE and objectives that the BOT, management team and staff are pursuing.

Miss Christina Withey has started teaching in the last New Entrant class in Room 7 and will be in this position until the end of the school year. Mrs Anna Murphy also returns for a day per week in Room 7 as well. A special welcome to all.

EXTENSION SCIENCE PROGRAMMES

One of the trends we have noticed over the past few years is that children's knowledge and understandings in Science have not been as 'practical ' as in the past. The Board of Trustees have supported action to address this in 2012. We are very fortunate to be able to utilise the skills of Mrs Paula Kinsey who has been taking four separate groups of children from Pohutukawa and Totara teams on a weekly basis. A range of scientific activities for the groups are developing a whole range of skills in the children, who in turn are sharing their experiences, ideas and activities with other members of their classes. It also allows the teachers time work with smaller groups in their class. This will continue for the remainder of the year. HEARING RESEARCH STUDY

Matthew Barker, a local audiologist, who received his doctorate in researching listening skills in children, is doing some research into hearing problems for school children in Hawke's Bay. He is particularly interested in how listening skills apply to a student's ability to perform at school. With your permission he will be visiting our school and testing your child. The test will be administered by iPad with headphones and takes less than 20 minutes. It is available for all school-aged children enrolled at Greenmeadows School. He has been testing at a number of other local schools in what could be groundbreaking research.

Once the data can be analyzed properly, the school and parents will be made aware of any concerns so proper follow up can be made. This will also include information regarding any general hearing concerns as well. The study is **not invasive** and there are **no negative effects** from being involved in this research. If you give permission for your child to be involved, please fill in the permission form below. This can be returned direct to the teacher of your eldest child at Greenmeadows School. We are aiming for at least 80-% of our children to be involved in this study. Please return the forms by Friday 8 June.
