GREENMEADOWS SCHOOL ENROLMENT ZONE

For several years now Greenmeadows School has not had an enrolment zone. This has meant new enrolments could live anywhere and enroll at our school.

Today our roll has risen to 429, which is the highest number of students for many years. Because of this growth in student numbers an enrolment zone is due to be put back in place, probably early in the 2013 school year. This means it is vital that we know about as many new enrolments in the school into next year and beyond. Having this information helps us plan with more surety. If you have a preschool child, friends, relatives or neighbours that know they intend to enroll their children at Greenmeadows School, please get them to make contact with the office as soon as possible

Out of zone families can apply for enrolment and when the school has an accurate count of children due to enroll for the remainder of the year, this can be easy to manage.

The Napier City Council have developed a strategy to get people using and valuing our local parks and reserves. One idea is to get schools adopting a site and establishing a link with this area.

On Sunday a ceremony will see our school formally accept the role of acting as guardians of the 'pou' and storyboard to be erected in Taradale Park. The ceremony will not take long, and we want children to bring their singing voices and ukuleles if they have them to sing our school song as part of the proceedings.
