GREENMEADOWS SCHOOL ENROLMENT ZONE

The last two weeks have seen a lot of activity around the formal re-establishment of our school's enrolment scheme. We can not sustain growth the way it has been occurring over the course of this year. Predictions are we would have finished 2013 with a roll in excess of 450 and obviously not enough space to accommodate numbers of this size.

For this reason there will be an official enrolment scheme put in place for the school effective of Monday 11 February 2013. From this date onwards the school will not be able to accept any enrolments for pupils who live outside our enrolment area for the remainder of the 2013 year. The only exception to this will be out of zone children who currently have a sibling attending school. If this situation changes we will inform you. A map and description of the proposed zone is displayed on our school notice board.

The school breakup and prize-giving will be held next Tuesday in the Heart of the School outdoor stage. The start time is 6.30pm and the ceremony expected to last for about an hour.
